
What are the consequences if I don't follow class rules?

- 1. Warning: the teacher provides a verbal reprimand/reminder to student
- 2. <u>Exercise</u> swearing (within my earshot) will automatically mean 10 push ups, sit ups or jumping jacks.
- 3. <u>Lunch Detention:</u> short time spent during lunch to contemplate conduct or catch up on missed work.
- 4. Parental contact: An email or call home about conduct.
- 5. <u>Referral to Administration</u>: a student will be immediately referred to administration for severe or ongoing behavior problems.

A Note On Reading

Time will be given for silent reading of novels, and students are expected to have a novel for every class, but students will also need to read at home. There is evidence that reading for pleasure not only impacts on reading achievement but also increases:


- ✓ general knowledge (e.g. Cunningham & Stanovich, 1998);
- ✓ a better understanding of other cultures (Meek, 1991);
- ✓ community participation (e.g. Bus, van Ijzendoorm & Pellegrini, 1995);
- ✓ a greater insight into human nature and decision-making (Bruner, 1996).
- ✓ I encourage students to read books, magazines, graphic novels, etc. that interest them.

Complete and submit <u>all assignments</u> in the proper format and <u>on time</u>. Assume all assignments are due at the beginning of the next class unless told otherwise. Assignments not present when marked in class may receive a score of "0".

Re-doing assignments: students will be asked to redo assignments that are not satisfactory. Students may request to re-do an assignment by immediately discussing this with Mrs. Carr. Assignment re-dos and/or late assignments must be completed within 1 week of the assignment's original due date to be marked. Ultimately, assignments that are not handed in will receive a mark of zero.

Homework

Regular home reading and the odd assignment completion, if work is not completed in class time, will make up the majority of homework in Language Arts 7.
